Langley Park Artisan Golf Club celebrates 75th Anniversary

Langley Park Artisan Golf Club (located in the London Borough of Bromley) is this year celebrating its 75th anniversary (technically it is their 76th year, but celebrations were pushed back a year due to Covid-19). The club was formed in 1945 with nine members, and has gradually grown over the years, and now operates with a membership limit of 40.

LPAGC has its own "clubhouse" affectionally known as "The Taylor Cabin" in honour of JH Taylor who, as well as designing the Langley Park course, was a founding member of the Artisan movement.

LPAGC enjoy a very healthy relationship with the Langley Park Golf Club, and plays a match twice a year against the men's section, which is always highly competitive, played in the right spirit and great fun. LPAGC are proud to report that they are current holders of the trophy that is played for!



The Artisans also play twice yearly with the ladies' section of the main club, on a mixed greensomes basis, which is enjoyed equally by all whom participate.

Throughout the year, LPAGC hold numerous internal competitions for its members (including medal, stableford and matchplay formats), and has an annual club championship played over two rounds over a weekend – this was very recently won (both scratch and handicap) by one of LPAGC's more longer standing members, and for many years Club Secretary, Clive Peddle.



In addition, LPAGC are fortunate to have regular fixtures (home and away) against other Artisan/Permit Holder clubs across Kent, of which, arguably, the most prestigious is Royal St Georges. LPAGC also compete in the annual Surrey Artisans Golf Union 7's competition, which it has won twice.

LPAGC works hard on creating an inclusive and friendly environment for its membership, and holds a number of social events throughout the year, and frequently encourages partners to get involved. For example, members' partners recently attended a group golf lesson kindly given by the Club professionals, which was followed by a BBQ and drinks on the patio of the Taylor Cabin.



To commemorate its 75th Anniversary, LPAGC are both holding an 18 hole competition, followed by a dinner in the main club, and are also having a short golfing tour in Sussex, playing three different courses and staying overnight during August.

Moving forward the club would like to organise a summer tour every year visiting other artisan clubs throughout the UK, so if anyone is interested in hosting us in 2022 please do get in touch with the Secretary, Mark Parkinson.
