Proud members of the Aldridge Artisans are teeing off their anniversary year with a range of commemorative events to mark 125 years of Artisan Golf in the West Midlands, which includes a golf day and celebratory dinner in July.



Based at the superb Little Aston Golf Club since 1978, the Artisan section goes from 'strength to strength' and with 37 members we are the largest Artisan club in the Midlands. The Artisans began life in 1898 under the name of Sutton Coldfield Working Mens Golf Club, and stewards, greenkeepers, gatekeepers and numerous caddies played at Sutton Coldfield Golf Club. It explains why the current Aldridge Artisans kit sports the Latin logo 'opifices sumus' which means 'we are the workers' however as we are based in the Black Country, we tend to favour the regional interpretation of 'workers ay we'!

We have a rich history and we've seen many prominent members and characters throughout the years. During the 1940s and 1950s our Artisan ranks were bolstered by Charlie 'Whippet' Ward (nicknamed for his fast play), a man who Peter Allis described as 'Britain's finest professional in the post war years'. Charlie played in 3 Ryder Cups and in 1965 won the World Seniors Championship at Formby Golf Club, defeating Sam Sneed on the 37th hole. John Matthews - his nephew and also a long standing Artisan, said at the time, 'he wasn't bad for an Artisan'!!

And so to the present day and the future.....The club is in a healthy position due to solid foundations and our aim is to continue to uphold traditions while looking forward with a positive vision. We continue to work closely with the parent club while remaining proud members of the AGA and the Northern Section. In this important year our secretary Steve Dyer is also Captain and he commented;

'We are really incredibly proud of the work that the Aldridge Artisans do, both on and off the course and we can't wait to celebrate our anniversary this year. The golfing world has evolved so much over the years, and many Artisan clubs have shrunk or disappeared entirely, but we are still a thriving club. We are looking forward to supporting many more passionate golfers in realising their ambition.'

Hook Heath Artisan (Oldest member Profile-Tribute) George Stewardson



Ever-youthful, enthusiastic and an active Hook-Heath Artisan member (at Woking Golf Club) are just some of the attributes and characteristics of current playing member and 87 years-young George Stewardson (aka 'George').

'George' (pictured with 2023 club Capt. Tim Pacey) joined Hook Heath Artisans in 1970 with a handicap of 16 eventually achieving 4, and in his cheery words says.... 'I'm privileged to have been a HHA member, played against many clubs and aspiring golfers, carried out my artisan work duties and served on the committee's and seen many great course changes at Woking Golf Club in my time'.

'My first set of clubs were 'Sam Snead' irons''and I bought them 'two-at-a-time' from a shop in Aldershot' quipped George.

Some of his golfing career, contributions and achievements also include:-

- Installing the original toilet, basin and shower at HHA clubhouse.
- Served on HHA committee for many years.
- serving for 15 years on Surrey AGA Committee
- Captain of Surrey AGA team twice.
- Played in Surrey AGA Individual knockout final twice (won one lost one)
- Twice Captain of HHA 7s team (winning once)
- Won a £5 prize voucher for a letter sent to the AGA magazine suggesting 'it's the artisan committee responsibility to promote their members work duties for parent clubs''
- Had a total of 3 holes-in-one at Woking GC (1st Par 4 7th & 10th Par 3)
- Won HHA Terry Cup medal competition in 2021.

Being an artisan-golfer is in the family, as George's brother (Tommy Stewardson – sadly passed) was also a Hook Heath member and served as Chairman on HHA committee for many years. Philosophically, George reflected that being an family-artisan at the same club is wonderful and means he could'on one day I'd be playing with Tommy in a team foursomes or club match'..... 'and the next day play against him in a club stroke or match-play competition.....

There is much more to George than the above, and with his handicap now at 24 he is still seen actively playing-the-fairways and greens' and enjoying his golf at Woking GC, and is available to recall most (if not all) of HHA's history at will (cost a pint to those that want to know).... or happily debate about and watch (sometimes suffering) with his life-long football team Spurs in the artisan clubhouse.

At 79 years young, active playing member Andrew Elliott is one of many 'Elliott-family-artisans' at Hook Heath c/o Woking GC (including his brother Michael and son Steve – current Committee member). Andrew (pictured with 2023 Capt.) joined Hook Heath Artisans as one of 6 juniors in 1961 with a handicap of 14 and went on to win the HHA Juniors cup and has played in the Alba competition. Additionally, along with the annual artisans work-duties Andrew (as a younger man) helped lay the redesigned 9th fairway.

He served on the Hook Heath Artisan committee for over 14 years+, has a total of 3 holes-in-one (all at WGC 7th hole see pic - last one in 2022) and now plays off 21 handicap.

Andrew mused 'I was taught to play golf by an artisan-legend Mr Jimmy Willet' and 'I've enjoyed all my golf, the club membership and have won several of our clubs competitions, but disappointingly the one that eludes me is the Lawrence Foursomes'..... wryly adding 'I'll keep trying though and my recently acquired 460cc Callaway driver helps me a lot these days'.

The Hook Heath Artisan membership would like to thank Andrew for his many past artisan-contributions and hope he continues to enjoy his golf at Hook Heath/WGC.

Obituary

AGA Vice President Roy Wood

It is with deep regret that I have to inform you of the death of Roy Wood. Roy had been a Vice President with AGA for many years and recognised for his strong support of artisan golf with the AGA, Hertfordshire County and particularly Hadley Wood.

Roy joined Hadley Wood on 1st April 1985 and during his membership became Chairman of the greens committee and organised the Greystone Staffing Fund amongst other duties. In 2007 he was a member of the Hadley Wood team for the televised R & A's Rules of Golf Quiz where they reached the semi final only to be beaten by the eventual winners, Lahinch.

Roy, who celebrated his 90th birthday in February 2022 was the first President of Hadley Wood Artisans serving some 25 years as president only vacating that position to care for his wife June.

Roy donated the President's Cup which is one of Hadley Wood's major annual competitions and was instrumental in cementing strong relations with the Parent Club.

As you can see from the above Roy was always keen to help others for the good of Golf Particularly Hadley Wood Artisans and will be greatly missed by all his family and friends.
